Inspired by hearing the midnight ringing of the bells at Waltham Abbey in the southeast of England, Tennyson sings out a call for change—not only in time, but also in lived experience. The poem is a call to let go of the tired past and to embrace the future with enthusiastic faith and hope in the daily, eternally new life of Christ's Kingdom. That Kingdom is breaking out even now in ways we do not always see; it is leading us to final revealing of Christ the King on the Last Day of time and the first day of Eternity. I hope you find even some parts of it meaningful, and I pray with earnest certainty that next year will be the best yet.

Annual Parish Meeting and Vestry Nominations

We are now accepting nominations for the five persons who will serve on St. Peter's Vestry. The election will take place at our Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, January 21, 2024. Fifteen members serve on the Vestry in staggered three-year terms.

The Vestry is responsible for managing the facilities and finances of the congregation and for assisting the Rector in leading the ministries, programs, and fellowship necessary to our growing congregation. According to our Bylaws, any member is eligible to be elected who is:

- At least eighteen years old
- Confirmed or Received by a bishop in the Episcopal Church
- A Communicant (who has received Holy Communion at least three times in the previous twelve months) in Good Standing (one who has been "faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.")

Any church member may nominate one person to stand for election. The person who offers that nomination must secure the consent of their nominee and is responsible for sending to the Church Office the nominee's short biography and a photo suitable for publication. If the person nominated has served previously, two years must have elapsed from the conclusion of their previous term.

Those who agree to be nominated must be willing to:

- Attend a Vestry Retreat on Friday evening, February 2, and Saturday morning, February 3.
- Be present to meet with Bishop Bauerschmidt at his Annual Visitation on Sunday, February 4.
- Attend the monthly Vestry meetings as determined by the new Vestry at the retreat.
- Participate in other meetings as needed by the Vestry Committee on which they serve, as determined at the Retreat.
- Help count the Sunday offering with another Vestry member according to an agreed-upon schedule.
- Be present at major events in the life of our congregation, including regular Sunday services.

According to Section 4.03 of our Bylaws, which declares that no person shall be eligible to serve until two (2) years have passed since their previous Vestry service, the following individuals are ineligible for nomination: Mike Sharpton, Ginger Moon, John Breyfogle, Mark Sells, Jane Rodriguez-Keeton, Gail Lewis, Louis Davis, Travis Groth, Tom Brewer, and Carol Baker.

What does a member of the Vestry do?

The fifteen (15) members of the Vestry serve as the Board of Directors for St. Peter's who help the Rector advance our congregational health. Five new members are selected each year to serve a term of three years; sometimes, special elections take place to fill the seat of those who for one reason or another needed to step down from the Vestry during the year.

Vestry service is a tremendous privilege and responsibility—no other ministry provides such a close perspective on how God moves in and through His people's gifts, challenges, and opportunities.

Unsurprisingly, such service calls for a meaningful investment in time and energy. Specifically, members of the Vestry attend:

- A Friday night and Saturday daytime orientation and retreat (February 2-3, 2024)
- A diocese-wide "Day with the Bishop" as an orientation to the life of our diocese (Saturday, March 9)
- Monthly meetings as a whole
- Monthly meetings as members of one of four committees: Finance and Governance, Property and Grounds, Christian Life, and Christian Service
- Major congregational events:
 - Pig Roast
 - Whitsunday
 - Rally Day
 - o Our Bishop's Visitation (Sunday, February 4, 2024)

Members of the Vestry also take turns counting the weekly Sunday offering and are asked to offer their annual pledge before the campaign begins.

Please pray for God's guidance as we discern whom He calls to this service this year. If, in your prayers, someone comes to your mind, please ask the person for their permission for you to give us their name as a nominee.



Commemorates the Feast of Saint Charles, King and Martyr

Charles Stuart was born 1600, son of James I of England and VI of Scotland. In 1625, Charles became King on the death of his father, James.

Oliver Cromwell and his followers were opposed to both King and the Church and were anxious to protestantize the Church and make it into a Presbyterian-Puritan body; whereupon, in 1645, Civil War broke out, and Charles was taken prisoner to await trial. After the mockery of a trial, Charles prepared for his death. On 30 January 1649 King Charles I was martyred for refusing to abolish the Church and the order of bishops.

In 1660, after eleven years of persecution, Church and monarchy were restored, and 30 January was set aside as a special day of remembrance of the King's martyrdom. In 1661, the Convocation of Canterbury and York canonized Charles and added his name to the Kalendar of Saints. But for Charles I, under God, the Church would not have been restored intact at the Restoration.

In 2015, the General Convention of the Episcopal Church added "January 30, Charles I of England, King and Martyr, 1649" to its Kalendar of Saints in the Book of Common Prayer.

Vestry Meeting Bullet Points from December 19, 2023

- Vestry Formation: Father Bowhay presented a lesson on why we celebrate Christmas on December 25 (see article here, or go to http://tinyurl.com/d3yar8h9)
- Stewardship Report: As of December 17
 - We have received 92 pledges totaling \$313,407
 - 10 are new pledging households totaling \$20,880
 - 37 are increases from last year's pledge totaling \$175,135
 - 29 households are pledging the same as last year, totaling \$85,340
 - 15 are decreases from last year, totaling \$30,852
 - There are 4 households who will not pledge in 2024
 - 2 are deceased, and gave \$10,900 in 2023
 - 2 will not pledge for other reasons, and last year gave \$3,600
 - There are 32 pledges not received from previous pledgers totaling \$90,365.
 - The Treasurer is sending personal letters to each of these households to ask for their continued support. Previously, these households were contacted directly by members of the Vestry. The Finance and Governance committee has decided to change this practice.
 - To the best of our knowledge, there is no reason to believe that these pledges will not be renewed.
- The Finance and Governance Committee will present several draft versions of the 2024 budget at a special meeting on January 9. The final vote on that budget will take place at another special meeting on January 16.
- Voted to approve \$100 Christmas bonuses to 11 members of the staff
- Voted to approve Outreach grants to:
 - Columbia Cares (\$1,000 from the Hales Fund)
 - St. Peter's People's Table Account (\$500 from the B.I. Naddy Fund)
 - Harvest Share (\$545 from the B.I. Naddy Fund)

Financial Summary for November 2023

Below please find a very broad overview of St. Peter's financial activity in the month of November 2023. We will receive the December Financial Report at our Vestry meeting on the third Tuesday in January. This summary is drawn from our Treasurer's Report to the Vestry which is much more detailed. Those who would like to see it may find it in the hallway that leads to the Church Office where it is always posted.

A few things to consider when examining these figures:

- As of December 1, St. Peter's had received about 75% of the funds that had been pledged (that is, gifts that were promised through a pledge card). In the past, we have received about 20% of our pledged revenue in December. This is not uncommon in churches across the country.
- As of December 1, St. Peter's had received just under 100% of "plate" revenue (that is, gifts made without being pledged) that had been estimated for the 2023 budget. In the past, substantial unpledged gifts also take place in December. Again, this is not uncommon in churches across the country.
